NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

Perceptions of the Pediatric Education Committee, requests from community physicians, and previous educational evaluations were used to determine the content of this conference. A questionnaire sent several years ago to general physicians in Tucson showed an 88% interest in a one-day conference that would cover topics discussed in the Pediatric Grand Rounds offered by the department. The number of attendees and the comments received over the years verifies the need for this activity.

PRACTICE GAP:

Because the Department of Pediatrics is a leader in pediatric research, its faculty represent national and international standards of care for "best practices" involved in diagnosis, management, and understanding of pediatric illnesses. Thus, the Practice Gaps identified include gaps in the level of understanding and learning between the conference attendees and the speakers. This conference will bring community health care providers to a superior level in practice competence and patient outcomes. The Practice Gaps addressed in this activity were determined by reviewing new information on a disease or problem, recent changes in standards of care, lack of some knowledge and/or the application of changes in therapy for the disease or problem.

1. Identify current methods of diagnosis and treatment of diseases affecting health of children.
